<sup>3</sup>Don't be **selfish**; don't try to **impress** others. Be **humble**, thinking of others as better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Don't look out **only for your own** interests, but take an **interest** in others, too.

## Philippians 2:3-11

<sup>5</sup> You must have the same **attitude** that Christ Jesus had. <sup>6</sup> Though He was God, He did not think of **equality** with God as something to cling to.

<sup>7</sup> Instead, He **gave up His divine privileges**; He took **the humble position** of a slave and was born as a human being. When He appeared in human form,

<sup>8</sup> He **humiliated Himself** in obedience to God and died **a criminal's death** on a cross. <sup>9</sup> Therefore, God elevated Him to the place of **highest honor** and gave Him the **Name** above all other names,

## Philippians 2:3-11

<sup>10</sup> that at **the name** of Jesus **every knee** should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and **every tongue** declare that **Jesus Christ is Lord**, to the glory of God the Father.
